Lancaster is the oldest inland city in the United States, and was an important munitions center during the Revolutionary War. It became the capital of the American colonies on September 27, 1777, when the Continental Congress was fleeing British forces, who had captured Philadelphia. From 1799 to 1812, Lancaster was the capital of Pennsylvania. Lancaster and Lancaster County have been the home of prominent historical figures, including President James Buchanan, Congressman Thaddeus Stevens, and Robert Fulton. Lancaster is home to approximately 56,000 residents, where historic preservation and a cutting-edge arts scene live and thrive side by side.




MAIN COURTHOUSE 2nd Floor


