- 1. It would be best for students to take BA101 in the fall term.
- 2. Students may take EC101 and EC102 in any sequence.
- 3. BA270 and BA271 are to be taken in the 2nd year. Students should take BA270 in the fall and BA271 in the spring term.
- 4. AC 205 and AC206 should be taken in sequence normally beginning the fall of sophomore year.
- 5. MA251 should be taken in the sophomore year. Students should take any necessary prerequisites in the first year depending on their math placement.
