Dr. Colin Helb is Associate Professor of Communications, Program Director of the Film Studies Minor, and Faculty Advisor of WWEC, Elizabethtown College's student operated radio station. He is the President of the Mid-Atlantic Popular & American Culture Association and Area Chair of Internet Culture for the Popular Culture Association. Dr. Helb's research interests include media representation, the history of media technology, and popular culture.

Dr. Kyle C. Kopko is Director of the Honors and Pre-Law Programs, and Assistant Professor of Political Science at Elizabethtown College. He regularly teaches courses on American politics, constitutional law, and judicial behavior. He is the co-author of the book, "The VP Advantage: How Running Mates Influence Home State Voting in Presidential Elections" (Manchester University Press). His research has been featured in the Wall Street Journal, The Washington Post, The New York Times, the National Law Journal, C-SPAN, and Fox News Channel.





Dr. Dmitriy Krichevskiy joined Etown faculty in 2011. He obtained his Ph.D. from Florida International University and has research interests in entrepreneurship, labor, applied microeconometrics, and education. Prior to academic career Dr. Krichevskiy worked in the hospitality industry and in various consulting capacities. He currently teaches courses in macroeconomics, microeconomics, game theory, econometrics, family business, and data mining.

Dr. Brian Newsome is Associate Professor of History and Assistant Dean for General Education and Assessment. He earned his Ph.D. from the University of South Carolina and specializes in French history. Newsome received the New York State Association of European Historians' Bailey Prize for his article entitled "The Women of the Pavillons: A Case Study" (Historical Reflections/Réflexions historiques, Winter 2012). His current project, which McGill-Queen's University Press will publish in May 2016, is a new translation and



annotated edition of <u>Invasion 14</u>, French novelist Maxence Van der Meersch's renowned account of the German occupation of northern France during World War I.



Dr. Sanjay Paul teaches introductory and advanced courses in economics, including international economics and economic development. He has developed study tours to Geneva and New York (United Nations), Brussels (European Union) and Bangladesh (Yunus Centre). His research interests include globalization, trade policy and innovation. He writes on economic issues for the regional newspaper, academic issues for the college newspaper, and whatever interests him in his blog. He has a Ph.D. in economics from the State University of New York, Buffalo, and Bachelor's of

Technology in Civil Engineering from the Indian Institute of Technology, Madras.

members will discuss Donald Trump's candidacy for the Republican presidential nomination, Trump's surprising political success, and what it means from a variety of disciplinary perspectives.

Dr. Fletcher McClellan is Dean of Faculty and Professor of Political Science. A member of the Elizabethtown faculty for over 30 years and dean since 2010, he has served in many leadership roles at the college, including Interim Provost on two occasions. He has presented dozens of papers in such areas as the American presidency, politics and film, and teaching and learning in political science. Co-authored with Dr. Kyle Kopko and others, his article on the Presidential Medal of Freedom was featured last December in the New York Times. Additionally, he offers commentary on current politics for area media outlets.



Anna Carper Award

The Anna Carper Excellence in Library Research Award is intended to recognize that the library is a "laboratory for scholarship," from the first year of college study onward.
