

# Carlos R. Leffler (1922 – 1994) Georgiana E. Leffler (1925 – 1996)



Carlos Leffler was born in Jackson Township, Lebanon County on October 19,1922, to John L. and Mary (King) Leffler. He had two siblings, John King Leffler, and Myrna C. Leffler. Georgiana E. (Balsbaugh) Leffler was born on November 9, 1925, to Homer R. and Edna C. (Shaak) Balsbaugh. She had three siblings: Kathryn M. Hickernell, Robert Balsbaugh, and Jeanette R. Shaak. To the left is Carlos Leffler and his family as recorded in the 1940 U.S. Census. He was 17 years old and lived in Jackson, Pennsylvania with his father (age 47), mother (age 46), brother (age 21), and sister (age 10). Pictured left are the highlighted names.

Carlos Leffler was chairman of the board and president of Carlos R. Leffler Inc. and ABE Oil Co which had plants in "Emmaus; CR's Friendly Markets, Petroleum Products Equipment Co., Leffler Transportation Co., C.R.L. Inc. and All-American Truck Plazas." He began serving on the board of trustees for the college in 1968 as an associate trustee and was elected secretary of the board in 1979. He also represented the Southern District of the Church of the Brethren on the Mutual Expectations Committee. In 1989, he was awarded an honorary doctorate of humanities for his service to the college. He was head of the capital campaign for the new college chapel which is now known as "Leffler Chapel.

"He was a director, executive board member and a member of the personnel finance committee of Lebanon Valley Brethren Home, Palmyra, Lebanon County. He started the Good Samaritan Fund of the home. Leffler was a past president of the Richland Lions Club and former board member of the Hamilton Bank, Reading Hospital and Central Pennsylvania Blood Bank. He



was to be named business leader of the year this fall by the Pennsylvania Chamber of Business and Industry. He was a member of Myerstown Church of the Brethren, Lebanon County. 14"

Leffler Energy was established in 1941 and was created with the merging of two long-time fuel services companies -- The SICO Company and Carlos R. Leffler, Inc. <sup>15</sup>

"In 1876, Schock Coal and Lumber of Mount Joy, Pennsylvania, the predecessor to The SICO Company, added kerosene to their list of products. Shortly thereafter, gasoline, fuel oil, motor oil and grease were added to the list. Since 1955, the company has expanded its business to include southeastern Pennsylvania, southern New Jersey and Delaware. The Carlos R. Leffler company was formed in 1941, when 17 year old Carlos borrowed \$380 from his father to buy a truck to transport fertilizer, coal and milk for farmers throughout Lebanon County, Pennsylvania. A short time later, he began providing fuel and heating oil deliveries. Since 1941, Leffler Energy has been providing coal and petroleum products and services to homes, businesses, government agencies and agricultural operations throughout central and eastern Pennsylvania. With over 180 years of combined experience, Leffler Energy, is solidly committed to providing customers with one standard of excellence and a superior level of service! <sup>16</sup>





Pictured above are advertisements in the 1983 and 1984 newspaper for Lancaster Farming.<sup>17</sup> Carlos Leffler would commonly put advertisements in the Lancaster Farming newspaper for Carlos R. Leffler Inc.. Carlos and Georgiana Leffler were always generous donors of the Lebanon Market Animal Auction. The Lebanon Market Animal Auction was an annual sale of champion market

animals that were exhibited by 4-H youth. Carlos Leffler had once been a member of the Lebanon County 4-H Beef Club. Kenneth Winebark, a former Lebanon County extension agent and long-time Lebanon Market Animal Auction staff member said in the August 12, 1995, paper for Lancaster Farming that Carlos Leffler was "...one of the strongest supporters here in Lebanon and surrounding counties at the state Farm show. 18" On the front cover of the January 19, 1991, issue of Lancaster Farming, a new farm show record was set. Carlos Leffler paid the record-setting \$8,000 to Daryl Bomgardner, age 17, for his grand champion junior market swine. "According to Lebanon County Agricultural extension agent Kenneth Winebark, prior to the sale Bomgardner told Winebark that he would be satisfied to receive \$5,000 and whatever price was offered above that would be donated in equal portions to the agricultural youth support organizations. 19" "Bomgardner donated a total of \$3,000 to the FFA Foundation and the Friends of 4-H. 20" Following the purchase of the animal, Leffler said "that he had been a member of 4-H as a youth and that instead of sending the home-bred animal to slaughter, he wanted to donate it back to Bomgardner for use in the young man's breeding program."



"The new Admissions building, recently opened, had been named The Leffler House in honor of Carlos R. Leffler and wife Georgiana.<sup>21</sup>" In his Elizabethtown College named its new admissions center, The Carlos R. and Georgiana E. Leffler House, recognition of their service and dedication to the College.<sup>22</sup> The house is a two-story colonial house that had previously been called Sigma House.<sup>23</sup> It was also the former home of previous President, A.C. Baugher.<sup>24</sup>

In need of a building large enough to accommodate all Elizabethtown College students at once, the college received funding from the Kresge Foundation in 1994. Carlos was a major advocate for the Chapel and was head of the capital campaign for its building. In 1995, Leffler Chapel and Performance Center opened. It is one of the most recognizable buildings on campus. <sup>25</sup> In 1996, the Chapel was dedicated to Carlos Leffler's memory. To the left is a photograph of the "dedication"

of the Carlos R. and Georgiana E. Leffler Chapel and Performance Center, January 28, 1996."26
