James B. Hoover Class of 1975

James B. Hoover received his MBA in Finance from the Graduate School of Business at Indiana University. He holds a BS degree in Business Administration from Elizabethtown College (Pennsylvania) where he presently serves as a member of the Board of Trustees and for a six-year term, was responsible for the management of the College's endowment as its outsourced CIO.²

Prior to founding Dauphin Capital Partners in 1998, Hoover was a General Partner of Welsh, Carson, Anderson and Stowe, (WCAS). WCAS, a management buy-out firm specializing in health care and information services businesses, has raised over \$20 billion since the firm was founded in 1979.³ During his association with WCAS, Mr. Hoover was involved with ten private healthcare service company investments representing a total capital commitment of nearly \$300 million.⁴

Prior to joining WCAS in November of 1992, Hoover was a General Partner of Robertson, Stephens & Co. Robertson, Stephens was a major bracket investment banking firm specializing in the financing of emerging growth companies with a particular emphasis on the healthcare industry. Mr. Hoover joined Robertson, Stephens in 1984, establishing the firm's New York office, initially serving as the senior research analyst following the medical services industry. In

1987, Mr. Hoover assumed responsibility for the healthcare corporate finance group. During his association with the firm, Mr. Hoover was involved with 33 healthcare companies public offering transactions that raised an aggregate of \$1.4 billion.⁶



Mr. Hoover was a Vice President of the Investment Management Group at Citibank N.A. from 1977 until 1984.⁷ During his tenure at Citibank he was responsible for healthcare industry research, founding and managing two investment funds specializing in public healthcare stocks, and for initiating private healthcare company investments for institutional investment clients.⁸

Mr. Hoover has been a director of over 20 private and 5 public healthcare companies. Presently, he is a director of American Farmland Company, a REIT specializing in the ownership of US farmland. He is a

member of the Special Projects Committee of Memorial Sloan-Kettering Cancer Center which raises funds and evaluates funding proposals from physicians interested in pursuing cancer research projects.⁹
